Commemorating its 34th year in 2016, the nonprofit [501(c)(3)] Washington Regional Alcohol Program (WRAP) is a coalition of diverse interests using effective education, innovative programs and targeted advocacy to end alcohol-impaired driving and underage drinking in the Washington, DC metro area. Through public education, innovative health education programs and advocacy, WRAP is credited with historically keeping the metro Washington area's alcohol-related traffic deaths lower than the national average.

WRAP, however, may best be known to area residents via the organization's popular free cab ride service for would-be drunk drivers, SoberRide® – a public safety initiative which, since 1993 alone, has provided 65,219 no-cost cab rides home to Greater Washington residents who otherwise may have driven drunk.



Don't forget about WRAP's SoberRide® program this Halloween. If you're celebrating with alcohol between the hours of 10:00 pm on Saturday, October 29, 2016 and 6:00 am on Sunday, October 30, 2016, call 1 – 800 – 200 – TAXI (or #WRAP for AT&T wireless users) and be afforded a free and safe taxi ride home. (Must be 21 or older to use this service.)
