Corral Design Guide

Surface mural design options for scooter and bicycle corral zones.




How to Use the Guide

The guide consists of two types of corral designs.: full color and stencil only designs. The first set of eight (8) designs are "full color" designs which consist of two layers: a base layer and a stencil layer. The second set of five (5) designs are "stencil only" designs and consist of one layer: a stencil layer. Each design is followed by the recommended stencil dimensions for that design. These sizes can vary as needed.

When painting, follow the order of the layers to recreate the designs.

Step by Step Guide

1. **Choose Design.** Choose your design from the options in this guide. Full color designs require an extra step of painting the base layer and then painting the stencil layer, whereas stencil only designs require only one layer using stencil patterns on the asphalt.

2. Acquire Supplies.

- a. Stencils. You may order the stencils associated with your design or cut them yourself out of cardboard, poster board, thin plastic, or other similar products. See the resource list for an example of a company that creates stencils.
- **b.** Paint. Use the approved color code guide when ordering paint from your local hardware store, paint store, or arts and crafts store. If choosing a full color design, it is recommended to first prime the ground with a coat of white paint.
- c. Materials. Heavy duty full-size rollers or wide paint brushes are recommended to apply the white prime coat and base layer. For the stencils, use spray paint or a 2" to 4" paint brush. Other materials include plastic tarp, drop cloth, or cardboard boxes to protect the surrounding area from paint spills; painter's tape or duct tape to paint straight lines; and gloves to protect your hands from paint.
- 3. **Prep the Surface.** It is recommended to power wash the surface with an asphalt degreaser. This product is found at any hardware store or online, usually under the name "driveway cleaner". Simple Green is a good brand option available at Home Depot. If you do not have a power washer, you can also use a deck brush (attached to a pole) and a degreaser. Make sure the surface is completely dry before painting. A leaf blower will aide in drying the surface more quickly if needed. If you wash one day and paint the next, be sure and sweep the area right before painting.
- 4. **Paint the Corral.** Check the weather forecast to make sure you can expect no rain for at least the next 24 hours. Your paint will dry best when it's warmer than 50 °F (10 °C) outside. For full color designs with multiple base colors, it is recommended to use painter's tape or duct tape to keep lines straight.
- 5. **Safety.** Use traffic cones to protect the area and to make drivers aware that you are in the roadway. It is advisable to wear some type of fluorescent vest. Do not store materials in tree boxes. Ensure that you bring enough cones to block off a paint storage area.

Approval Process

1. **Applicants.** Business Improvement Districts (BIDs), Main Street Organizations (MSOs), and Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (ANCs) are the only eligible organizations who can apply to paint a bicycle and scooter corral. Other organizations or groups must partner with the local ANC, respective BID, or MSO. The ANC, BID, or MSO will be responsible for maintenance of the approved design.


2. Process.

- **a.** ANCs, BIDs, or MSOs must complete a Corral Ground Mural Application and submit it to Neighborhood.Planning@dc.gov. The application includes information about the proposed location, the chosen design, the date of installation, and contact information.
- b. The Neighborhood Planning Team will review the application and notify the applicant of their decision within three (3) business days.
- **c.** If the application is approved, the Applicant can move forward with implementing the design. Once installed, the Applicant must send a photo verification of the completed corral via email to Neighborhood.Planning@dc.gov.

FULL COLOR DESIGN 2: LIGHTNING























FULL COLOR DESIGN 8: CUT OUT CIRCLES



STENCIL ONLY 3: BLOSSOM AND LEAF






STENCIL ONLY 4: BLOSSOM AND BOLTS




STENCIL ONLY 5: CIRCLE AND NOODLE





- Bucket Paint for Surface Layer: Any high-quality concrete, garage, porch or floor enamel. A clear concrete sealer can be applied after the design is painted for maximum durability. Simple Green is a good option and available at Home Depot and online.
- Spray Paint for Stencils: Montana Chalk Series or matching color.
