
SNAPSHOT OF DC BIKE FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE¹

- 56 miles of Trails
- 69 miles of Bike Lanes
- 6 miles of Cycletracks
- 2,600 Bike Racks installed since 2001
- 2,000 Capital Bikeshare Bikes
- 202 Capital Bikeshare Stations
- 85 miles of Signed Bike Routes


DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION FACTS²

- 4.5% (15,000 a day) of District residents regularly biked to work in 2013
- 13.6% (45,000 a day) of District residents regularly walked to work
- 38.5% (127,000 daily) of District residents commuted by public transportation
- 37.4% (102,000) of District households do not have access to a motor vehicle³
- 37.6% (124,000) of District residents regularly drove to work


DC Travel to Work by Bicycle & Bike Lane Development

Explanation of Data

- Miles of Bike Lanes:** Data collected by the District of Columbia Department of Transportation.
- Means of Travel to Work, American Community Survey (ACS) 2013.** Data is collected for workers 16 years old and over who reside in DC regardless of their place or work.
- Vehicle Availability:** U.S. Census Bureau data from the ACS. It includes the number of passenger cars, vans, and pickup or panel trucks of one-ton capacity or less kept at home and available for the use of the household members.
- Reported Bike Crash Data:** Data collected by the District of Columbia Department of Transportation.
